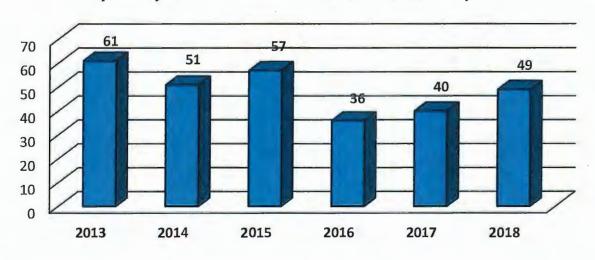

City of Crytal River Tracked Crime Annual Comparison



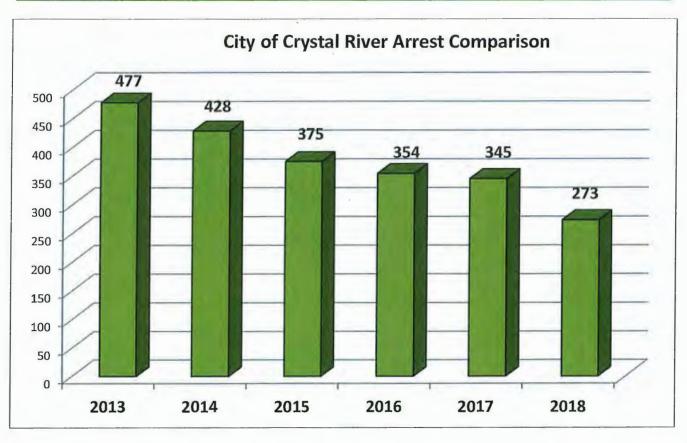

City Manager Burnell confirmed discontinued use of synthetic substances in parks. Council member Brown confirmed past consideration to create a dog park, and existing dog park at Blue Bird Springs.

<u>Keith Raym- 1290 NW 19th Ct.-</u> Expressed concerns with CCSO contract, ordinance enforcement and citizen safety.

<u>Carol Raym- 1290 NW 19th Ct.-</u> Commented on incoming Planning and Development Services Director, importance of customer service, and need for leadership to support staff.

Meredith Bleakley- Spoke in favor of opening a drone park at Legrone Park.

<u>Josh Wooten-Executive Director- Citrus County Chamber of Commerce-</u> Announced Manatee Festival date, expressed concerns with method of evidence gathering for short term rental code violations, noting pre-emptive statute and suggested formation of a task force.

<u>Belinda Singh- 18138 Swan Lake Dr.- Lutz-</u> Discussed short term rental-related code enforcement case and expressed concerns with method of evidence gathering.

8. CITY ATTORNEY

A. City Hall Land Disposition Update

City Attorney Rey provided an update on questions related to City Hall property disposition as it relates to deed restrictions and Charter provision that incorporates House Bill 1783 language declaring portions of the City Hall property as public. She confirmed that charter language does not restrict conveyance, and title search results reflect previous conveyances to other public entities with title insurance provided in each case. She advised that since nothing in the legislation authorizing conveyance, and House Bill language in charter designates city hall property as a public park, a charter amendment is recommended to either remove or amend that section of the charter.

B. Charter Amendment Options

City Attorney Rey provided an overview of the Charter amendment processes, including the Charter Review process stipulated in the City Charter and the charter amendment process provided for in F.S. 166.03, noting consideration of referendum during the next general election or a special election.

Council discussion was also held regarding special election cost, charter review committee workshops and timing, based on determination of selected city hall site.

9. CITY MANAGER

A. Motion to approve the Bayside Plan for long-term development and investment

<u>Background</u>: [Agenda Sheet Requested Motion: Motion to approve the Bayside Conceptual Plan for long-term development and investment.

Summary: The Bayside Plan and Heritage Plan were developed several years ago with the intent to bring a vision of long-term investment to Crystal River's Downtown. The Bayside Plan over the last several years has been modified overtime to show requested changes and new requirements. Staff believes this is a good time to lock in this living document.

The plan includes a town square, new playground, water park, linear park, rerouting of NE 5th Street, additional dockage at Kings Bay Park, mooring field, and additional multiuse path in various sections.

Staff Recommendation: Approve as a living document that can be changed by Council at appropriate times. End of Agenda Sheet]

City Manager Burnell provided a brief overview of the item and Mayor Meek recaps previous discussion held during CRA meeting.

Motion to approve the Bayside Conceptual Plan for long-term development and investment was made by Council member Brown; seconded by Vice Mayor Guy. Moti9on carried unanimously.

B. Discussion and consensus on items related to the development of a Town Square at South Citrus Avenue and Highway 19

<u>Background</u>: [Agenda Sheet Requested Motion: Consensus on items related to the development of a Town Square at South Citrus Avenue and Highway 19.

Summary: City staff is seeking consensus on several items related to the development of a Town Square at South Citrus and Highway 19. During the last meeting Council requested staff to bring back the concept as discussed, utilizing the corner property at South Citrus and Highway 19 as a Town Square. In early stages of the project developing a scope or vision of the site is important. Further guidance or direction is required to maximize the use of this corner. The following questions are to assist in scope development.

Should this area be designed as a passive or functional site?

Is there a need to develop sound attenuation for functional activities?

Net gain or loss of parking in this area? Is it one of the primary goals to have parking on this site?

If used for functional activities what do you envision?

What if any permanent structures do you want on the site?

Should the Town Square be lighted for evening hours?

Do restrooms be developed into the Town Square?

Should the wetlands be integrated into the Town Square?

Should the Scow be utilized in the development?

Should the Pump House be integrated into the Town Square?

Staff is looking for guidance on budget for this project and discussion of the funding source.

Staff Recommendation: NA

City Manager Burnell reviewed the item and sought feedback from Council. Council discussion was held during which consensus was reached on the following preferences: functional site, landscaping, parking, lighting, incorporation of pumphouse and inclusion of a fountain. Discussion was also held regarding restroom facilities and structures (permanent versus temporary). City Manager Burnell reviewed consensus items, confirmed a timeline and suggested inclusion of informational signage.

C. Motion to approve a funding agreement with FDEO in the amount of \$25,000.00 through the Competitive Florida Partnership Funding Program

<u>Background</u>: [Agenda Sheet Requested Motion: Motion to approve a funding agreement with the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity in the amount of \$25,000.00 through the Competitive Florida Partnership Funding Program.

Summary: The Florida Department of Economic Opportunity recently approved Competitive Florida Partnership grant funding in the amount of \$25,000.00 for a Waterfront Master Plan. There is no match required. The contract was received in late December for Council approval and execution by the Mayor. The contract and scope of work are attached for reference.

The City requested the grant to assist with development of a long-term strategy to expand access in existing public (or Private) spaces to accommodate commercial activities while preserving the integrity of waterfront neighborhoods. The city has found that the demand in the selected waterfront area is greater than what can be

reasonably accommodated by existing facilities. The master plan will identify potential properties that could be acquitted in the future to accommodate additional waterfront access.

Staff Recommendation: Staff recommends approval.

D. Motion to approve Three Sisters Springs Center Closures on Non-Season Holidays

<u>Background</u>: [Agenda Sheet Requested Motion: Motion to approve Three Sisters Springs Center Closures on Non-Season Holidays

Summary: Three Sisters Springs / Three Sisters Springs Center is open 7-days a week year-round, except for Christmas Day and Thanksgiving Day. Staff is proposing closure on the following City recognized holidays that fall outside of manatee season (Nov.15- March 31); Good Friday (on years it is outside of season), Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, and Veterans Day.

In the off season, Three Sisters Springs Center employs 3 full-time Visitor Experience Specialist (VES), 1 part-time VES, and 3 part-time drivers. On City recognized holidays, part-time employees are paid time-and-a half, full-time employees are paid time-and-a half plus 8 hours of holiday pay for working the holiday. These off-season holidays have low visitor numbers hence the proposal to close on these low visitor holidays.

Staff Recommendation: The closure of Three Sisters Springs Center and land access to the property on city recognized, non-season holidays; Good Friday (on years it is outside of season), Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, and Veterans Day.

<u>End of Agenda Sheet]</u>

Motion to approve Three Sisters Springs Center Closures on Non-Season Holidays was made by Council member Holmes; seconded by Council member Fitzpatrick. Motion carried unanimously.

10. CITY COUNCIL

A. Transparency in hiring process (posting government jobs) & Nepotism (practice among those with the power or influence of favoring relatives or friends, especially by giving them jobs)

Vice Mayor Guy provided an overview of the requested item and expressed concerns regarding previous information received regarding the advertisement of the Planning and Development Services Director position vacancy, noting dates of posting and removal. City Manager Burnell confirmed that the misinformation was unintentional as the City Manager position does not directly handle posting of vacant city positions. Mayor Meek also expressed concerns with misinformation.

Council member Fitzpatrick inquired about how the discussion related to nepotism and Vice Mayor Guy confirmed there were additional concerns. City Manager Burnell provided a brief overview of the hiring process used to hire the selected candidate, confirming 7 interviews conducted by staff. Council member Fitzpatrick expressed concerns with the appropriateness of the agenda item and Council member Holmes discussed the role of City Manager as it relates to hiring practices, as specified with in the city charter. Council member Brown also inquired about how the discussion related to nepotism, noting a lack of evidence that such issues existed.

B. Evaluate and discuss the Water Patrol cost (wasteful spending) vs. actual efficacy. (What are yearly costs for salary, boat, insurance, fuel, and other items?)

Financial information was provided to Council members at the meeting, as the item was request was received after publication of agenda packets (ATTACHMENT D).

Vice Mayor Guy provided an overview of the requested item and expressed concerns regarding water patrol cost and effectiveness. Council discussion was held regarding the issues and discussions leading up to creation of the position, including need for on the water presence, benefits of the position, CCSO enforcement on the water and a need for further discussion on the matter at an FY 20 budget workshop. Ms. Russell also provided confirmation that the figure in the financial information did not include the CCSO costs.

C. Trolley out to bid to a private vendor

Vice Mayor Guy provided an overview of the requested item, expressed concerns regarding city trolley operations, and requested consideration to privatize the operation. Staff provided clarification regarding existing agreement with USFWS as it relates to city oversight of visitor access. Council discussion was held regarding existing contract with USFWS as it relates to trolley operations, with Council member Fitzpatrick noting benefits to downtown businesses.

D. US Flag Code "The flag may be displayed twenty-four hours a day IF properly illuminated during the hours of darkness"

Vice Mayor Guy provided an overview of the requested item and expressed concerns regarding a broken solar light located below the flag displayed in front of city hall that has since been repaired. Concerns were expressed regarding need for the agenda item, with Mayor Meek confirming the need for discussion.

E. Council discussion on the short-term rental ordinance and enforcement
Mayor Meek provided an overview of the requested item, discussed challenges associated with
existing pre-emptive statutes and called for consideration of potential options to allow for resort
housing in certain zoning districts. City Attorney Rey provided clarification regarding existing Land
Development Code and pre-emptive statute, noting risks associated with amending existing code.

Council discussion was held regarding consulting with the Florida League of Cities, working with the legislative delegation and potential solutions including zoning revisions. Mayor Meek sought consensus to work to expand resort housing in certain areas of the city. City Attorney Rey provided further clarification regarding risks associated with amending current code and discussed existing resort housing code as it relates to enforcement challenges, noting language in the code that establishes advertisement of availability as primae facia evidence.

Mayor Meek expressed concerns regarding existing resort housing code and certain methods of evidence gathering utilized by city staff, requesting consideration to revise existing procedure that allows for such methods. Mayor Meek also inquired about alternative method of evidence gathering, noting issues created by the current practice.

Mayor Meek, Council member Fitzpatrick and Vice Mayor Guy all expressed concerns regarding method of evidence gathering currently being utilized by staff. Council member Guy also expressed concerns with treatment of property owners at code enforcement hearings.

Council member Holmes spoke in favor of continued enforcement of existing resort housing ordinance on behalf of city residents and Council member Brown inquired about alternative methods of evidence gathering.

Mayor Meek spoke in favor of complaint-driven code enforcement response in lieu of creating opportunities for property owners to violate.

Consensus was reached to work with state delegation to explore real options from a legislative stand point. Staff was also requested to prepare correspondence requesting input from the Florida League of Cities.

F. Council discussion on designating Legrone Park as a drone park

Mayor Meek provided an overview of the requested item, proposed by Ms. Bleakley and Council discussion was held regarding potential issues and alternative sites, with Mayor Meek noting recently adopted county ordinance establishing drone park and regulating use. Consensus was reached for staff to identify alternative sites.

- G. Council discussion on Council hosting a staff appreciation day and luncheon Council discussion was held during which consensus was reached for staff to plan and execute a staff appreciation day luncheon to be held on an upcoming Friday.
 - H. Council discussion on Riverwalk project

Mayor Meek discussed the status of the Riverwalk Phase 2 project, associated funding and a request from the Citrus County Board of County Commissioners to make a presentation on the project status during an upcoming meeting, with City Manager Burnell and Mayor Meek to attend.

I have been investigating the use of the data regarding the tourist tax for the purpose of code enforcement in Crystal River. Specifically, organizations who enable short term rentals such as Air B+B and VRBO (Vacation Rental By Owner) offer and sometimes mandate collection of taxes for tourism. Citrus County and two other Florida counties have elected to use the State of Florida Department of Revenue as their collections arm.

A recent (4Q 2018) short term rental code compliance action was ruled against by the Magistrate based on the argument that the Air B+B listing registered could not be identified as the property in question for code compliance.

I believe that the detail records from tax collection and remittance to the State of Florida contain registered payers, property identifiers, and specific amounts corresponding to those rental locations. They are an evidence of behavior in compliance with taxation law.

In a recent communication with the Citrus County Clerk of the Court and Comptroller (Angela Vick) I enquired as to whether the detail on tax receipts was available. On December 3, 2018, I received this response:

Good Morning Mr Langlois - in response to your question: Per FS 213.053, sales and related tourist tax receipts are confidential.

2)(a) All information contained in returns, reports, accounts, or declarations received by the department, including investigative reports and information and including letters of technical advice, is confidential except for official purposes and is exempt from s. 119.07(1).

How do we know the tax was paid by a given property?"

The Comptroller's office replied:

Unfortunately, this question is out of our jurisdiction as the Clerk's Office. The Florida Department of Revenue will be better able to respond to your question. We cannot interpret their laws and statutes. http://floridarevenue.com/Pages/contact.aspx

I would like to know if our code compliance officer can use the data for her official purpose, and how she can access that data. We need to arm our staff with the tools they need to prevent our neighborhoods from devolving into hotels. Commercial use limitations in residential neighborhoods must stay in tact to the degree possible.

I would like to address the unfriendly attitude the city has been projecting. In my neighborhood alone, there have been many so called code violations of late. In years past, people were given friendly notifications and reasonable explanations, with opportunities to correct.

When I attended the recent code compliance meeting, I was appalled at what appeared to be predatory stalking of citizens who are potential violators. It felt to me that traps were being set, all in the name of revenue.

Indeed, when I looked at the budget, the line item "Violation of Local Ordinance" had a *projected 2018* amount of 95,871, where the *adopted amount* in 2018 was 48,000. Unless I am misunderstanding, this means that there was optimism that the fines could be doubled. It isn't a stretch to imagine how this could be accomplished.

I ask that the council please consider my remarks when they discuss how the city could improve, and I submit a copy of this to the clerk to be entered into tonight's record.

I am attaching a statement that I prepared for tonight's City Council meeting. I am attaching it as a PDF document and will also copy and paste in the text below. Thank you.

Statement of Deborah Currie for the 1/14/19 Crystal River City Council Meeting

Mr. Mayor, Council Members, City Manager:

My name is Deborah Currie. I live at 1019 S.E. 4th Ave, within the city limits of Crystal River

I am very concerned about last month's City Council discussion about suspending enforcement of some ordinances, and this month we see the topic of the short-term rental ordinance and enforcement on the agenda. I hope the discussion on the January agenda is not tied to the thought of suspending enforcement or removing or changing the short term vacation rental ordinance.

First, let me say that:

- I support the current vacation rental ordinance and support increased enforcement.
- I welcome longer-term rentals in our **residential** neighborhoods. There is nothing in the current ordinance to prevent people from renting out their homes under leases of 3 months or more -- or 6 months, which is the State's definition of "transient rental" for collection of sales tax
- I *understand* the importance of tourism to our city. However, I strongly support keeping <u>daily</u> rentals in the areas zoned non-residential.

What "short term rentals" are not:

These are not nice elderly retirees who come for quiet enjoyment of our city.

These are <u>not</u> small families of 4 who spend their annual one week vacation here.

These are <u>not</u> *occasional* noisy neighbors --- daily and weekend rentals result in a party atmosphere <u>every</u> weekend.

These are <u>not</u> visitors who spend money locally – they bring trucks full of coolers, which are full of food and drink for their 3 or 4 night stay.

What "short term rentals" are:

They are large groups of 15 - 22 people crammed into a 1,700 square foot home; doing the math, some have to be sleeping on couches or on floors.

They are large groups of *unrelated* people, who often don't even know the other people staying in the other bedrooms; one person rents it and then **sub-divides** or **sub-rents** to others to share expenses.

They are there to party, often disturbing the peace on the canals (where sound carries long distances) at all hours of the night, while children and families are trying to sleep.

They arrive in as many as 8 separate vehicles -- PLUS boats, boat trailers, and small watercraft parked overnight on the front lawn or in the city right-of way, or even a large pontoon boat parked in the street overnight.

They are daily renters, averaging 3 nights with no investment in the community or respect for the neighborhood.

They are a business -- the daily/weekend turnover of renters, collecting bed taxes, etc, *rises to the level of conducting a business* -- which should be in an area zoned for business and should be licensed as a business.

They are "Bed and Breakfasts" – but without the onsite manager, which means they are hotels.

Hotels do <u>not</u> belong in residential neighborhoods, where small homes are on less than 0.2 of an acre.

Our personal nightmare:

The examples I have given are real, they are from our personal nightmare last summer. The number of people and vehicles is real – we have hundreds of pictures and dozens of videos we can offer you.

We lived an absolute nightmare last summer. The house across the street in our residential neighborhood was bought in April 2018 with the <u>specific intent</u> to operate it in the business of daily rentals. The new owner, who lives in Colorado, turned it into a weekend fraternity house, with 15 – 22 people staying there every weekend from Memorial Day through Labor Day and beyond, even a bachelor party weekend in the fall.

It was only through the dedicated work and persistence of code enforcement personnel, and the code enforcement hearing process, that we finally got relief from this nightmare.

Quality of Life:

These weekend rentals were extremely stressful for us. They had a negative impact on our quality of life, and the quality of life of many of the other neighbors who make their homes in our residential neighborhood.

We constantly had to endure:

Cars and boat trailers parked all over the front lawn and blocking the street.

A continual stream of cars repositioning themselves in the driveway and on the lawn – all hours of the day and night, as renters attempt to get in and out.

Lights coming on at all hours of the night, as cars were repositioned to people could get in and out.

Trash and recycling bins left out at the street for days at a time – directly in front of our home, with trash spilling out into the street on occasion.

The stench from scallop remains were left out baking in the hot summer sun for three days on several occasions. And once maggots were confirmed growing in the recycling bin where scallop remnants had been left. We were forced to smell this from our property as well as when walking or driving to and from our property.

Loud partying at all hours, clearly in violation of the noise ordinance, with the sound carrying quite far over the water.

Trespassing and vandalism of absent neighbors properties

Aggression directed at us by one group of renters, who came to our door and yelled at us for taking pictures and had the sheriff's deputy sent to our house to intimidate us.

We had to request an extra Sheriff's patrol for our street, due to the increased partying, large numbers of vehicles, and trespassing taking place.

This is a residential neighborhood, where people live with their children or visiting grandchildren.

They are small lots – less than 0.2 of an acre, so the houses are very close together.

The streets are very narrow – two cars can barely pass each other, so there is not enough room for large trucks carrying pontoon boats on large trailers to park or turn around and still allow for residents and emergency vehicles to get through.

In conclusion:

When we bought our home in our *residential* neighborhood, we relied on the residential zoning. *We did not sign up to live across the street from a hotel or fraternity house.*

I welcome longer-term renters, people who have an investment in the community who will treat our residential neighborhoods with respect as their own homes. There is nothing in the current ordinance to prevent people from renting out their homes under leases of 3 months or more (or 6 months, if they want to avoid having to collect sales tax). This is appropriate for a residentially-zoned, family neighborhood.

However, once you turn it into a business, with the daily or weekend turnover of renters and collection of bed taxes, etc, *that rises to the level of conducting a business* -- which should be in an area zoned for business and should be licensed as a business.

I would like to see better enforcement and collection of bed taxes.

For those legally renting for 3 months or more: the owners should make all renters aware of the city ordinances regarding noise, trash, parking (including recreational vehicles), and open containers inside the Kings Bay Drive bridge.

I recommend that the City obtain from the Dept of Revenue (through the County) detailed listings of which properties are paying their sales and bed taxes, and enforce collection of unpaid taxes.

I recommend that the City provide Code Enforcement with additional tools necessary to enforce the vacation rental ordinance to keep daily rentals out of our residential neighborhoods.

The existing ordinance requiring a minimum 3 month rental period is critical to maintaining the residential neighborhoods of Crystal River. Please let the many hotels and motels and designated commercial areas be the places

where we welcome tourists to see and enjoy our environment. And allow our families to leave peacefully in their residential neighborhoods.

Thank you for allowing me the opportunity to voice my opinion.

Departmental Monthly Reports Summary

CITY MANAGER

FINANCE DEPARTMENT:

General Fund

Revenues for the first quarter of the fiscal year are running a little higher than expected. At the close of the first quarter, we have completed a little over 25% of the year; however, we have currently received 44.0% of our budgeted revenue (about 19% more). Expenditures overall are at approximately 20.4% of budget - lower than normal for this time of year.

CIP

Revenues in the CIP Fund are a little low. Both the state revenue sharing and the local option gas tax are slightly down, but not of a significant concern. Management continues to look at funding for a new City Hall as reflected in the adopted budget.

Expenditures overall are minimal for the first quarter. Most projects are still in the bidding process or just getting started.

CRA

The CRA revenue (TIF Funds) will be billed by the close of January so this is the reason for little revenue reported to date. The only other revenues that will be coming in for the rest of this fiscal year are interest on bank accounts and some grant funding for capital projects. The final loan draw of \$1,500,000 was requested and received in November 2018.

Expenditures are primarily for the payroll, the Riverwalk project preparation costs and some signage. Costs will increase once the Riverwalk project starts back up.

Water/Sewer

Operating revenues are in line with budget for the first quarter (25.3%). Our operating revenues have been falling in lines with budget these last few years.

Operating expenditures are in line with budget.

Sanitation

Sanitation revenues are on track for the first quarter. Unfortunately, Advanced Disposal continues to be delinquent with their monthly billings so no payments have been posted for the first quarter resulting in a higher cash balance in the account than normal; management continues to address this with their staff/management.

Three Sisters Refuge

This fund is now in its third year of service and continues to see potential for the City.\Revenues are up this quarter in comparison to last year by approximately \$6,500 primarily in the area of annual passes and vending sales. Expenditures for the first quarter are a little high due to the purchase of the passenger van to utilize as a second transportation source or to utilized on slower days versus the expense and wear and tear on the trolley.

HR/RISK MANAGEMENT SUPERVISOR:

Human Resource Activities:

- <u>Planning and Community Director position</u>: Received and reviewed 10 resumes/applications; convened interview panel with Mr. Dumas, Ms. Russell, and me for 7 candidates. Sent offer letter to Mr. Scott Anderson that was accepted with a start date of February 18, 2019. Mr. Anderson will be relocating from Sioux Falls, SD.
- <u>Public Works Project Manager position</u>: The applications and interviews took place prior to my arrival. My first action for this position was to make the offer verbally followed up with the official offer letter which was accepted by Mr. John Mark Livingston who started with the city on December 3, 2018.
- Accounting Clerk/ Accounts Payable position: Received and reviewed 58
 resumes/applications; convened interview panel with Ms. Russell, Ms. Fay, and me for 8
 candidates (2 no-shows). Selected Maurissa Valentine who started with the city on
 December 26, 2018.
- <u>Human Resource/Risk Management Supervisor position</u>: Sent thank you emails to notify the people who interviewed for the position but were not selected.
- Contacted Inverness, Bellview, Wildwood, Fruitland Park, Brooksville, Citrus County Board
 of County Commissioners, and Hernando County Board of County Commissioners HR
 managers and introduced myself to establish a professional partnership for information
 exchange.
- Scheduled a BS&A webinar for January 10, 2019 with Steve Rennell to learn about the HR module its functions and integration with the existing financial city modules.

Risk Management Activities:

- Contacted the FL League of Cities regarding their many services. Mr. Trevor Reschny and Mr. Andy Hanson will be here at city hall on January 17, 2019 to provide an overview of the League's services.
- Contacted the FL League regarding the incident with the gate at the TSS trail on December 28, 2018.

CLERK'S OFFICE:

During the month of December Clerk's office staff attended and prepared minutes for $\underline{6}$ meetings, prepared $\underline{6}$ agendas and $\underline{11}$ agenda items, handled $\underline{16}$ public records requests, handled $\underline{0}$ lot purchase/sales inquiries and $\underline{0}$ deed inquiries, $\underline{3}$ plot marking requests, prepared and filed $\underline{1}$ liens, prepared

and filed $\underline{4}$ release of liens, performed $\underline{38}$ notarizations, and the Clerk's office facilitated $\underline{1}$ bid openings. Clerk's office staff published advertising and notices of meetings, ordinances and workshops.

THREE SISTERS SPRINGS:

Three Sisters Springs had a total of 7,162 visitors throughout the month of December. This was a 5% increase over December of 2017, with 343 more visitors. In December we took possession of the new Ford Transit Van.

On Saturday, December 22, the Federal government shut down. USFWS employees were furloughed. Volunteers could continue volunteer duties through 12/25, but as of 12/26 were no longer able to volunteer. Three Sisters Springs Center could continue operating as the official concessionaire for land access to Three Sisters Springs.

The CRNWR website posted the following message to visitors:

Due to the lapse in federal appropriations, this website will not be updated until further notice. Where public access to refuge lands does not require the presence of a federal employee or contractor, activities on refuge lands will be allowed to continue on the same terms as before the appropriations lapse. Any entry onto Refuge System property during this period of federal government shutdown is at the visitor's sole risk. Please read this important updated message about the <u>closure of National Wildlife Refuge System facilities during the shutdown,</u> and refer to alerts posted on individual refuge websites for the status of visitor facilities and previously scheduled events that may still occur during the shutdown.

- Sidewalk and paving improvements at the intersection of NE 3rd Ave/Crystal St near middle school were completed.

Drainage:

· Nothing new to report.

Grant Projects:

· Nothing new to report.

Miscellaneous:

- Crews repaired the irrigation pump house roof at Memorial Cemetery and painted the structure and speed bumps.
- DPW assisted with Grinchmas and parade.
- DPW prepared specs and solicited written quotes for Pete's Pier boat ramp fixed dock and piling replacement. Due to government shut-down, Staff has been unable to obtain clarification as to whether this in-water repair work can be performed during Manatee Season.

SPECIAL EVENTS:

We had another extremely successful year of The Christmas Tree Lighting presents Grinchmas. This year we estimated around 6000 people filled the streets of downtown for this holiday event. Many of the visitors to this event are from out of town, exposing so many people to our lovely city.

The Citrus County Chamber of Commerce produced another great Christmas Parade. An estimated 10,000 people line the sidewalks of Highway 19 to watch the County's only night parade. The events department is also working closely with the Chamber and Crystal River Rotary to plan the 2019 Florida Manatee Festival. We are also exploring the idea of keeping the Pirate Fest around with a new marketing idea and partner for 2019.

ASSISTANT CITY MANAGER

FIRE DEPARTMENT:

CRFD responded to $\underline{27}$ calls during the month of December, with $\underline{3}$ calls being canceled. There were $\underline{26}$ calls in city $\underline{2}$ of which was canceled, $\underline{1}$ outside of city calls $\underline{1}$ of which was canceled. Total water usage for the period was approximately $\underline{7,400}$ gallons.

COMMUNITY SERVICES

Business Licensing

There were 11 businesses that submitted paperwork to apply for a new business license and/or were approved for a business license in the City between December 1st and 31st, 2018.

- 8 business profiles were terminated in the system.
- 17 remaining businesses of the 686 businesses notified for renewal have not paid their annual business tax (due 9/30/18) to the City of Crystal River by the end of December. (2.5%).

Code Enforcement

- 1 complaint investigated
- 7 cases prepared for January hearing
- 13 cases heard at hearings
- 10 cases closed
- 0 cases referred to Citrus County
- Vacation rentals: 2 vacation rental violations

Worked with the Building and Planning Department to close out work without permit cases.

Park Rangers:

Hunter Springs Park: During the holiday season there was increased park activity.

Jim Legrone Memorial Park: The park was utilized by the Spot Family Center for their Christmas Jam.

<u>Kings Bay Park</u>: Several picnic tables near the kayak launch and a barbeque grill near the restrooms were overturned. No damage to the equipment was noted. Park ranger staff notified the Citrus County Sheriff's Office and the report number was given to the Public Works Superintendent.

Little Springs Park (Creative Park): Nothing to report.

Riverwalk: Park Rangers walked the trail almost every day inspecting for any problems

<u>Three Sisters Springs</u>: Park Rangers continued after-hours patrol of the refuge. People found on the boardwalk after operating hours were asked to leave.

Yeoman Park: Park Rangers continued patrol of the closed park. Yeoman Park remains closed since the water line was broken for a third time from the nearby county construction project.

General:

Park Ranger notified the Assistant City Manager, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission of manatees stuck in a long drainage ditch alongside Three Sisters Springs Trail. More than a dozen manatees had swum into the canal during a 4-foot high tide. Several agencies responded. The company that had installed a metal fence barricade in the canal that was contacted and with the help of the fire department, cut down the fence. The rescue mission was successful for all the manatees. The fence was completely removed and replaced with a higher fence to prevent a re-occurrence.

The stationary dock pilings at Pete's Pier showed an unusual amount of corrosion when exposed at low tide. One of the pilings broke, causing the dock to sag. Park Rangers placed cones and caution tape around the dock and notified the Assistant City Manager. Rangers continue to monitor the dock and the temporary barricade for safety.

Water Patrol

Observed a vessel feeding manatees near Three Sisters Springs and reported it to USFWS.

Staff provided additional assistance to USFWS volunteer staff and City Park Rangers during peak times and assisted USFWS staff and volunteers open or close manatee sanctuaries. Provided coverage during Crystal River Christmas Boat Parade. Aided various state and federal agencies with annual manatee health assessment. Aided with rescue of more than 12 manatees stuck in a drainage ditch along Three Sisters Trail.

12 vessel speed concerns; 25 dive flag concerns; 23 paddle craft/25 swimmers in Manatee Sanctuaries; 2 vessels loose from mooring and/or adrift or sunk; 12 bow riding concerns; 12 manatee interaction concerns; 22 lack of required safety equipment; 29 interferences with navigation of another vessel; 11 vessels without appropriate mooring lights; 9 people at Three Sisters Springs after hours, 1 vessel in swim area at Hunter Springs Park.

Responded to calls for service relating to the following concerns: Manatee interactions or injuries, uses of City docks at Kings Bay Park and Pete's Pier boat ramp, vessel speeds, and non-compliant visitors at Three Sisters Springs.

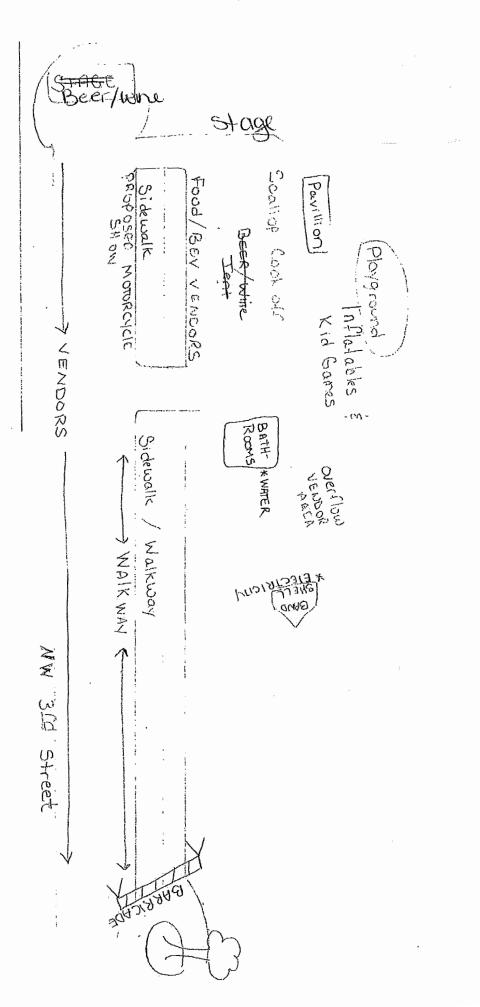
